**Current or past families receiving CalWORKs can get affordable or no-cost child care**

**Are you...**

- 1** Getting CalWORKs cash aid for yourself, are eligible for it, or got it in the past 24 months?
- 2** Caring for a child under the age of 13, or over 13 with disabilities?
- 3** In need of child care to work or look for work, go to school or training, participating in welfare-to-work activities, or tend to your family's needs?

**Yes to all 3?**

**You can likely get affordable or no-cost, stable child care for 12+ months**

## Here are the steps:

- Tell your CalWORKs worker you need child care.
- Ask your CalWORKs worker for a Child Care Request Form (CCP 7).
- Call your local Child Care Resource & Referral agency for help finding your family's best child care option.

**IMPORTANT!**

**You as the parent must be the one** to get, have received, or qualify for CalWORKs cash aid to be eligible for affordable or no-cost child care.

**If you don't qualify for CalWORKs child care, still ask** your local Child Care Resource & Referral agency about other affordable child care options.
